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## VATNZ QUARTERLY REPORT Q4 2022

### Executive Summary

The 4th quarter was fairly busy with a couple of major events. We were very pleased to be included once again in Worldflight and this was followed by the summer "Cross the Ditch."

Those events helped boost online statistics for the year but compared to 2022 ATC hours were down and aircraft movements increased slightly.

Total ATC hours for 2023 for the 4 main airports was 3121, a 32% drop compared to 2022. While this is the first decrease since 2018, we are still seeing ATC hours more than double what they were 4 years ago.

Aircraft movements for 2023 were 32957, a 2.5% increase compared to 2022.

### Administrative Report

#### Membership

Membership increased during the quarter from 766 to 771.

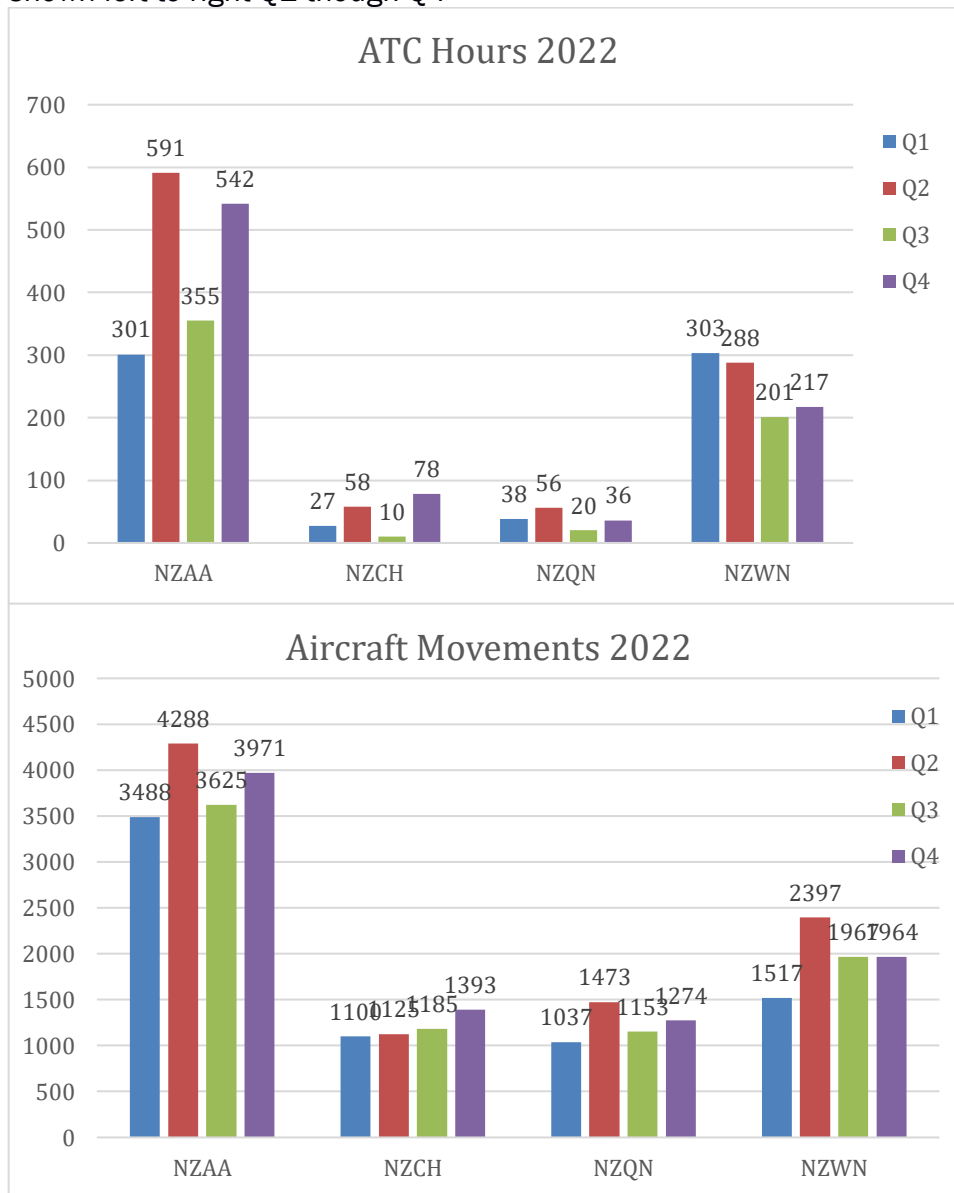
The number of active members, that is members who have connected to the network in the last 90 days decreased to 235

### Operations Report

#### 1. Project Update

The last quarter of 2022 has been a productive quarter for the Operations Department, with many projects being completed at a decent pace.

##### 1.1 Pilot Talk Guide

November 9<sup>th</sup> marked the release of the new VATNZ Pilot Talk guide which incorporated new procedures, updated imagery and a visual refresh to the document. Feedback has been mostly positive with the community and the release was timed perfectly for use throughout World Flight and First Wings (event for new pilots)

##### 1.2 Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs)

Currently the SOPs are undergoing a major re-write and facelift to bring them into line with new and improved information and procedures, the new SOPs will be displayed in an entirely new way with more information than ever before. We are moving along with this project quite well but as you can imagine this is a big undertaking for our small team. Rest assured we are working hard on this and look to bring an update to the community in the weeks to come.

##### 1.3 Sector File Generator App (SFG)

The SFG app has had a few new features implemented over the last quarter, with the most recent being a procedure checker. This new feature allows the SFG to scan through the ANR data that is provided to us, and check for errors or updates to all IFR procedures, including: SIDs and STARs, approaches and IFR fixes. This takes out some of the manual work involved in processing data for our datasets and reduces the chance of any old or incomplete data appearing in our datasets.

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### 1.4 Dataset Update

During Q4 the dataset has seen 8 AIRAC updates and a few smaller revision updates, these have all gone smoothly and have released on time. The NZ domestic dataset had 37,455 lines of code added to it this year and 35,474 lines of code have been removed. The Pacific Dataset has not seen any major updates but will continue to be maintained as required.

### 2. Staff Members

Currently, the Operations Department consists of 5 members including the Operations Director, however some members are spread across multiple departments or have significant real life commitments, hindering some of our projects. We will be looking to expand the team in Q1 2023.

### 3. Conclusion

Overall, the Operations department has had a great year and Q4 was no different, we have many projects in progress that will significantly increase the appeal of our division's airspace to both pilots and controllers, from all over the world.

- 2.2.1 Sweatbox training files are being updated and married to specific training and assessment exercises concurrent with the training refresh project. A Pseudo Pilot guide is also under development.
- 2.2.2 Work is yet to begin searching for a learning management system fit for purpose.
- 2.2.3 Reviewing the Mentor/Instructor policy and the instructor/mentor training materials continues with no time estimate to completion.
- 2.2.4 Courseware's are undergoing an audit and refresh process, with about 75% of this work completed.

#### 1. Events Update

##### 1.4 First Wings

VATNZ hosted its 1st First Wings event in December between Auckland and Christchurch. This had a good turnout from controllers and pilots; we will investigate hosting one in the future.



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### 1.5 24 hours of VATSIM

VATNZ is hosting the departure airport of Auckland for the first leg of the new 24 Hours of VATSIM event in March. The events team will work on getting a controller roster created closer to the date.

Currently, the Events Department has three members, including the Events Director. These members are all part of other departments and/or have other significant commitments. A request for applicants to join the Events Department was fielded to the division with negligible results. We will continue to seek new members to join the team throughout 2023.
